STEVENS POINT BREWERY

This month Bryan Wygert will be joining us from Stevens Point Brewery. Bryan is a representative for the brewery. He will be bringing the Spring Bock, which was recently released. This beer is brewed with specialty chocolate, caramel, and Munich malts along with Hallertauer hops. Spring Bock was introduced in 1938. The availability of this beer is limited and is offered January through March.

Frank Wahle and George Ruder established Stevens Point Brewery in 1857. Since this period, brewing quality beer has been passed on throughout many generations. Currently, John Zappa is the Brewmaster. He has been the Brewmaster for twenty-six years.

Other beers are also available at this brewery. These beers include: Point Special, Honey Light, Cascade Pale Ale, White Biere, Point Amber.

A New Beer Released

America's largest brewing company, Anheuser-Busch, released its latest product last week -- a beer that contains caffeine.

Obviously, this is a monumental cultural milestone and it raises important questions that we as a society must answer. For instance: Is adding America's favorite stimulant to America's favorite alcoholic beverage the greatest scientific breakthrough of the 21st century? Or the beginning of the end of civilization as we know it? Or what?

The beer is called B{+E} -- with the E raised up, like an exponent in math, which is why the name is pronounced "B to the E." (The B stands for Budweiser. The E stands for extra.) Sold in 10-ounce cans, B{+E} contains 54 milligrams of caffeine -- about half the dose found in an average cup of coffee. B{+E} also contains ginseng, the fabled herb, and guarana, an Amazonian berry frequently found in Brazilian soft drinks.

will be a registered BJCP Homebrew contest at this
event. The following three classifications may be
entered:

BOCK, DOPPELBOCK, WEIZEN BOCK

Bock – a strong malty beer with adequate but
not assertive hop bitterness. Color from
copper to dark brown. 6.25%ABV.

Doppelbock – similar to Bock however
darker and fuller. 7.5%+ABV

Weizen Bock – a dark wheat beer with
substantial malty body and fruity palate.
5 to 7%ABV


