**CONSTITUTION  
REVISION 101:  
MEMBERSHIP  
CHANGES  
CURRENT: ARTICLE I -  
MEMBERSHIP**

Section 1 REGULAR MEMBERS Such persons shall be entitled to membership privileges including receipt of the monthly association's mailings, use of the associations property subject to controls established by the Board of Directors, and attendance at the membership meetings or other scheduled membership activities.

a) Family membership - A husband and wife each of whom shall be entitled to one vote in the affairs of the association and to whom mailings of the association will be sent to the "family" under one cover.

b) Single membership - A man or woman who will be Entitled to one vote in the affairs of the organization. Section 3 CHARTER MEMBERS The rights of charter members shall be determined from their membership status as regular members or associate members.

Section 4 HONORARY MEMBERS No payment of dues or fees shall be required and honorary membership shall be conferred for life unless rescinded by the Board of Directors. Such members shall be entitled to receipt of the monthly mailings and attendance at the membership meetings but they shall not have voting status. The number of such memberships awarded shall be limited to two per year.

Section 5 LIFE MEMBERS No payment of dues shall be required of such members and they shall retain the same rights of membership. The number of such memberships awarded shall be limited to two per two year period.

Section 6 SUBSCRIPTION MEMBERS No additional rights of membership are granted to subscribing members and they shall not have voting status.

Section 7 RULES PERTAINING TO MEMBERSHIP Rules and qualifications governing membership rights not previously specified will be as set forth by the Board of Directors. Election to membership shall require the affirmative vote of the Board.

**CONSTITUTION REVISION 102: SERGEANT – AT – ARMS**

It's time for our next round of constitutional changes. This time the proposed change is for an additional board member. As the club grows and becomes more involved in outside events, it is important to have a central point of contact with who club members and outside people can communicate. There is a lot of confusion about who to contact and the process for the club's involvement in homebrew competitions, beer festivals, etc. The club needs a consistent way to communicate with outside people who ask for Beer Barons participation. Members also need a consistent way to communicate their willingness and desire to participate in outside events.

In addition to a point of contact, we also need a keeper of the club equipment, banners and other things which the Beer Barons owns and are necessary when the club has a booth at events. Over the years, with no one coordinating who has the equipment, some equipment has been lost. We need someone who can allocate and keep track of the items as necessary. This will allow better tracking of club-owned items and provide members with a single person to speak to when the equipment or banners are needed.

Another potential problem the board has noticed is that there is currently an even number of board members. The possibility of a tied vote exists. The current constitution states that the past president is a board member. So, in years that we have a past president attending board meetings we have an odd number. However, so far, this does not happen very often. Therefore, the new board position will have voting rights when there is no past president attending the board meetings.

The proposed constitution changes for this new position are below. The current constitution wording is listed for reference. The changes in the proposed sections are underlined.

**SERGEANT AT ARMS DESCRIPTION:**

CHANGE #1 *CURRENT: None. New Position.*

**PROPOSED: ARTICLE III - OFFICERS AND BOARD MEMBERS**

**Section 7 DUTIES OF THE SERGEANT AT ARMS**

**The following are the Sergeant At Arm's duties:**

- a) keep order at membership and board meetings
- b) safeguard any equipment the club may possess
- c) safeguard club signage and display materials
- d) coordinate the allocation and delivery of equipment, signage and display materials
- e) provide guidance and act a point of contact for members who wish club participation in an external event
- f) monitor the club's potential participation in external events and can decline or withdraw club participation in events if club resources are not adequate

CHANGE #2

**CURRENT: ARTICLE IV - BOARD OF DIRECTORS**

**Section 2 BOARD OF DIRECTORS**

The Board of Directors shall consist of the officers, immediate past president, and two members-at-large of the association. Members-at-large shall be elected to serve a one year term, with their election taking place in the same month as the officers.

**PROPOSED: ARTICLE IV - BOARD OF DIRECTORS**

**Section 2 BOARD OF DIRECTORS**

The Board of Directors shall consist of the officers, immediate past president, the sergeant at arms and two members-at-large of the association. The sergeant at arms only has voting rights when there is no past president or the past president is not in attendance. The Sergeant at Arms and the Members at Large shall be elected to serve a one year term, with their election taking place in the same month as the officers.

Mike Chaltry did a great job of facilitating the discussion there as attendees from the beginner session migrated over and picnic attendees stopped on by.

check out either the WoB Russian Imperial Stout or the Barons Picnic Dunkelweizen. Both brews are currently in secondary and are waiting to be kegged or moved on to barrel aging.

## CONSTITUTION REVISION 101: MEMBERSHIP CHANGES

### (CONTINUED FROM PAGE \_\_\_)

Section 8 DUES The Board of Directors by resolution shall adopt the membership dues schedule to be imposed for each category of membership. All dues shall be payable in advance. Members may be separated from membership for non-payment of dues.

### PROPOSED: ARTICLE I - MEMBERSHIP

Section 1 REGULAR MEMBERS Such persons shall be entitled to membership privileges including receipt of the monthly association's mailings, use of the associations property subject to controls established by the Board of Directors, attendance at the membership meetings or other scheduled membership activities, and shall be entitled to one vote in the affairs of the association .

a) Family membership – ~~A husband and wife couple living together each of whom shall be entitled to one vote in the affairs of the association~~ shall have all rights of a regular member and to whom mailings of the association will be sent to the "family" under one cover. Dues for the family membership will be discounted as set forth by the Board of Directors.

b) Single membership - A man or woman of legal drinking age who will be Entitled to one vote in the affairs of the organization shall have all rights of a regular member.

Section 3 2 CHARTER MEMBERS The rights of charter members shall be determined from their membership status as regular members or associate members.

Section 4 3 HONORARY MEMBERS No payment of dues or fees shall be required and honorary membership shall be conferred for life unless rescinded by the Board of Directors. Such members shall be entitled to receipt of the monthly mailings and attendance at the membership meetings but they shall not have voting status. The number of such memberships awarded shall be limited to two per year.

Section 4 LIFE MEMBERS No payment of dues shall be required of such members and they shall retain the same rights of membership. ~~The number of such memberships awarded shall be limited to two per two year period.~~ Life Membership is issued at the discretion of the Board of Directors.

Section 5 SUBSCRIPTION MEMBERS No additional rights of membership are granted to subscribing members and they shall not have voting status.

Section 6 TRIAL MEMBERS shall have all rights of a regular member except they shall not have voting status. Trial members can attend only three meetings without becoming a regular member. An individual may only have one trial membership period for life.

Section 7 GUESTS No rights of membership are granted to guest members and they shall not have voting status. ~~Guests must be attending with a Regular Member.~~ Meeting and event fees for Guests may be set at a higher fee than for Regular Members as set forth by the Board of Directors.

Section 7 8 RULES PERTAINING TO MEMBERSHIP Rules and qualifications governing membership rights not previously specified will be as set forth by the Board of Directors. Election to membership shall require the affirmative vote of the Board. The board shall have the right to refuse or terminate membership at any time.

Section 8 9 DUES The Board of Directors by resolution shall adopt the membership dues schedule to be imposed for each category of membership. All dues shall be payable in advance. Members may be separated from membership for non-payment of dues.

Last month when the brewblog went live we had a mere 5 award winning recipes out there for the club to view. As of this writing we have over 20 award winners (ranging from Best in Show to 3rd place finishers) and four brews that are currently in production - two kinds of Wheat Wine and the Dunkelweizen and Russian Stout that was made at the picnic.

Posting recipes (not just award winning ones) and brews in progress (BrewBlog entries) not only helps to share ideas within the club, it also helps to raise the profile of the club.

To date the BrewBlog has been utilized by users in Wisconsin, Missouri, New York, Kentucky, Illinois, Michigan, Washington, Colorado, Massachusetts, and Texas just to name a few states (that's not just web hits you IT geeks, those are states with an average site time of 3 minutes or greater).

We have American IPAs, Belgian Golden Strongs, Robust Porters, and a few Specialty Category brews out there for either printing or downloading. It's quite an impressive list but we have room for a lot more.

Take a moment to check out the site and see what it has to offer. It's free for all to reference or submit a review, however, if you'd like to post your recipes, create a brewblog, list an award, or have a member page you'll need to get a login and password from the administrator.

## PARALLEL BREW by Dan Schlosser

### Preparations continue for the next Parallel Brew

As before, we will select 5 or 6 brewers who will attempt to use the same (or equivalent) ingredients and recipe to brew the same beer. The resulting beer will be served at the January meeting where the club will be able to evaluate the results. One twist this time is that we will select both all-grain and extract brewers.

This is not intended as a competition, but rather as a learning exercise. We are hoping to get a group of volunteer brewers who have a variety of equipment types. Any differences in the resulting brews will hopefully reflect the type of mash, boil, and fermentation that is used by each brewer.

We are going to select the brewers at the October meeting. You will either need to attend the meeting or let me know if you want to be involved. We had 7 people volunteer at the September meeting, so we will be using a selection process to determine the brewers. So far most of the brewers have all-grain systems, so we would definitely like one or two extract brewers to step up.

Any candidate brewers will need to be able to let us know what type of system they use, and will be expected to provide details on their batch.

Once the brewers are selected, I will be in contact with each of them to nail down particulars of their system so that we can match the recipe to your system.

The Ingredients will be handed out at the November meeting. The beer should be brewed so that it is kegged, carbonated and ready to serve at the January meeting. If any of the brewers do not have a kegging system I will be able to provide a keg and assistance with carbonation, so don't let that stop anyone from trying.

The schedule for this is:

<b>Meeting</b>	<b>Activity</b>
October	Select Brewers
November	Distribute Ingredients and recipe
January	Serve the beer

This will give everyone 2 months to brew, ferment and keg the beer.

If you are interested in participating make sure that you attend the October meeting or let us know that you want to be included.

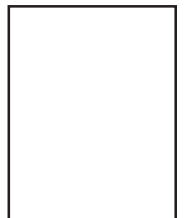
