Treasurer Report

Happy Brewing Barons. Typically speaking, January and February are busy times for the Treasurer of the Club because it is time to renew memberships. However, it has been a bit busier than normal given that the Club was required to close our accounts at US Bank and open new ones. To explain, when former and current Officers of the Club met at US Bank in January to change the people who could sign for the Club, we were told that the 4 old accounts that have been set up for years were set up incorrectly – they were set up as the Beer Barons being a Corporation, and they should have been set up as us being a 'Cooperative'. I am still sorting through the challenges of new debit cards, credit cards, checks, and making sure they are debited and credited from the proper accounts. With all this said, I am reporting that as of 1/31/19, our Club bank balance was approximately \$6,815. Comparatively, the bank balance one year ago (on 1/31/18) was \$4,572.

Total attendance for the January meeting was lower than normal with 66 individuals attending (44 Gold members, 21 members, & 1 guest). I attribute that to the 5 inches of snow that we had that day. We collected a total of \$1,095 at the meeting.

Remember that your 2018 membership expired on January 31st, and the renewal process is in full swing. You can still renew on PayPal, and it may be easier for you in that you don't have to wait in a potentially long line at the sign-in desk at the February meeting. Please check the club website to pay through PayPal and for membership options.

Membership Renewal Process


Just a reminder that current memberships expired 1/31/19





2019 Midwinter Homebrew Competition

Some interesting factoids about the 2019 competition:

- We received 663 entries -76 which were meads and 33 which were ciders.
 - 302 registered participants, judges, and stewards
 - Entries came from 31 states and Germany.
- All judging was performed by 1 Grand Master, 1 Master, 15 National, 48 Certified, and 6 Recognized Judges from all over WI, the Midwest, and AZ
 - The Beer, Mead, and Cider Best of Shows were all judged with panels comprised of National, Master, or Grand Master BJCP judges.


