President's Letter



Treasurer Report

Happy Brewing Barons. As of 5/31/19, our Club bank balance was \$6,677. The Club bank balance one year ago (on 5/31/18) was \$9,372. Attendance for the May General meeting was 72 individuals, and we collected \$240 in meeting and membership fees that night.

Thank you to Josh Strupp for organizing the Big Brew Day at Spike Brewing on 5/11/19. I hope everyone enjoyed themselves. We brewed a NEIPA, and 7 individuals brought home a little over 4 gallons of wort to add yeast and then dry hop with 9 ounces of hops (2 different additions). Each person that brought home wort was able to select which hops they wanted to use to dry hop. For example, I chose to dry hop with 3 hops -Simcoe (66%), Citra (20%), and Mosiac (14%). All 7 of these different combinations will be on tap at WOB on Saturday, 6/22/19. Try them all and see which combination of hops you like the most.



June -Did You Know???

Do you name your beers? I do, and it is one of the many things I enjoy about making beer. There is generally a story behind each beer I have named. Here is one of those stories...

The very first time I dried hopped, I did a lot of reading about putting hops in a muslin bag, and then putting something heavy in the bag that would make the bag sink so the hops don't simply float on top. Of course, the heavy object would have to fit in the small hole in a typical glass carboy, and I figured it should be something that wouldn't be bad for the beer. Well, I transferred an IPA from a primary to a secondary and was about to add the hops in a muslin bag, but I totally forgot about what kind of heavy object(s) I was going to put in. I started to think on the fly. I said to myself, I have a son that used to have marbles in his toy box – how about a bunch of glass marbles? How about some ball bearings – I could probably find those laying around. I started to tear my son's room apart, although I knew he hadn't played with marbles in at least 5 years or more. I ended up only finding 2 marbles and 1 ball bearing. These weren't heavy enough, so I needed more weight.

I started to think about bolts, nuts, or perhaps washers that would fit through that darn hole in the carboy. I had all of these, but they weren't stainless steel, and I was worried about negative reactions with the beer. Then I thought, how about a ring? I had a high school class ring that had some weight to it. How about my wedding ring? My wedding ring was made from gold, and gold is good for beer, right?

I ended up adding my gold wedding ring, my high school class ring, 2 glass marbles, and 1 ball bearing to the hop bag, and it turned out pretty good. I ended up naming the beer – **Golden Ring**. I remember my wife asking me where my wedding ring was, and she wasn't pleased when I told her that it was in my beer. Funny – from time to time, I will still throw my wedding ring into a batch for old-times sake.

I attached a picture of a tap handle I made for my **Golden Ring**, which I spun on a wood lathe. It is a gold ring around a hop, squeezing the juice out of the hop. Who knows, if I was to open up a brewery, I could sell this beer in 5-packs, and around Christmas time (5 Golden Rings).
