### **Treasurer Report**

Happy Brewing Barons.

As of 8/31/19, our Club bank balance was \$9,840. The Club bank balance one year ago (on 8/31/18) was \$6,925. Attendance for the Aug meeting (History of Fermented Beverages Meeting) was 81 individuals, which is exactly the average for 2019 general meetings. We had 4 people sign up since the August Treasurer Report, so we now have 152 members.

Our insurance has been issued, the books are closed on the Great Taste of the Midwest (we collected all the money, and paid out all the expenses), and I recently deposited \$1,260 from the picnic, although Jared Sutliff still needs to be paid for the expenses of the picnic.

Speaking of the picnic, a big thank you to Jared for organizing this fun event. The weather was fantastic, the food was good, and the beer was even better. Congratulations to Mike Rice for winning the best homebrew served at the picnic with his Munich Helles. His name will be engraved on the "Jerry Hetzel Memorial Mash Paddle". Also, congratulations to Kaitlyn Sande for winning the "Food with Beer" competition with her apple fritters. She will be honored with her name engraved on the coveted trophy.

### September Did You Know???



Have you ever heard of an individual named CT Melms, who lived in the 19<sup>th</sup> century, was born in Prussia, and immigrated to Milwaukee in 1843? Some of his descendants have argued that he was Milwaukee's First Beer Baron. Unfortunately for him and his family, he only lived to be 49 years old. Read on.

Melms married Maria Neukirch, the daughter of Franz Neukirch, one of Milwaukee's pioneer German immigrants and owner of an early Milwaukee brewery called South Side Brewery, located on Virginia St. (close to current day Great Lakes Distillery). Melms joined his father-in-law in the beer-making business, and together they ran a successful brewery. In 1848, Melms became the sole owner of the brewery, and renamed it 'Melms Brewery Co.' It became the largest beer producer in Milwaukee in the 1850s and 1860s.

In 1869, at age 49, Melms was accidentally stuck in the hand by a needle. The wound became infected, and he died at his home of complications from tetanus. He was survived by his wife, Maria, and their 7 children. A short time later, Maria sold the company to the Philip Best Brewery Company, which later named the brewery 'Philip Best & Co. South Side Brewery'. The Philip Best Brewery Company later became the Pabst Brewing Company. (It seems ironic to me that Frederick Pabst went down the same path as CT Melms in that Pabst went into business with his in-laws, later took over, and then renamed the brewery after himself).



Fast forward to March 17, 2018, when CT Melms' great-great-great-great rephew (yep, that was 4 greats), Bob Stack, opened a tap room in Hartland, WI, and named it 'Melms Brewing Co.' Melms Brewing Co. brews their beer at Brewfinity Brewing Co, in Oconomowoc.
