Merry Christmas & here's to a very Healthy, Happy and Fermented New Year! Cheers Rahshal






Friends of Wehr Flavors of Fall Fundraiser

Treasurer Report

Happy Brewing Barons.

As of 11/30/19, our Club bank balance was \$9,009.47, but this did not include a large check for \$1,219, so considering that, the club balance is actually closer to \$7,790. The Club bank balance one year ago (on 11/30/18) was \$6,276.69.

We had 87 people attend the November general meeting (Belgian Night), including 4 guests. We spent \$1,767.53 for Belgian night. The two largest expenses for this night were \$1,421.64 for commercial beer, and \$206.98 for 100 pretzels (from the Milwaukee Pretzel Company). Our current membership is 165 individuals.







Back in April 2019, I hosted a beer event in which we brewed 10 gallons of a Hefeweizen in my garage and served some great food that a friend of mine smoked (brisket, ribs & chicken wings). I called it 'Beer and Food Extravaganza', aka 'B&F Extravaganza', in which approximately 15 people attended. We also had games that we played including hammerschlagen, a sing-along, a free throw contest, and a German beer trivia contest. Even though the audience reading this article may find the 3 German beer questions below too easy, my audience at the B&F Extravaganza was not as knowledgeable about beer. The competition will be limited to 850 entries and we will be judging to the BJCP 2015 guidelines. All entries to be judged by at least 2 BJCP Beer, Mead, or Cider Judges, Professional Brewers, Professional Mead Makers, or Professional Cider Makers.

Entries will be accepted December 28th through January 25th
